Description of the charity's trusts.

The Group's governing documents are those of the The Scout Association. They consist of a Royal Charter, which in turn gives authority to the Bye Laws of the Association and The Policy, Organisation and Rules of The Scout Association.

The Group is a trust established under its rules which are common to all Scouts.

The Trustees are appointed in accordance with the Policy, Organisation and Rules of The Scout Association.

Additional governance issues

The Group is managed by the Group Trustee Board, the members of which are the 'Charity Trustees' of the Scout Group which is an educational charity. As charity trustees they are responsible for complying with legislation applicable to charities. This includes the registration, keeping proper accounts and making returns to the Charity Commission as appropriate.

The Trustee Board consists of the Chair, Treasurer and 10 Trustees (including 1 Ex Officio Trustee, and 2 coopted Trustees) and meets every 3 months.

Members of the Trustee Board complete Being a Scouts Trustee learning within the first 6 months of joining the Board.

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This Group Trustee Board exists to make sure the charity is well-managed, risks are assessed and mitigated, buildings and equipment are in good working order, and everyone follows legal requirements and the organisation's policies and rules. Their support helps other volunteers run high-quality and safe programmes that gives young people skills for life.

Risk and Internal control

The group has in place systems of internal controls that are designed to provid reasonable assurance against material mismanagement or loss, these include 2 signatories for all payments and comprehensive insurance policies to ensure that insurable risks are covered.

It has been an amazing year for Beavers, full of laughter and growth. Over the last year (April 2023-March 2024) the Beavers met every Thursday 4:45-5:45pm. We have 2 Assistant leaders and 3 Young leaders supporting our colony.

At the beginning of the year, we had Beavers swimming up to cubs and new beavers joining us, so we started the year with 24 Beavers. At present we have 18 Beavers Scouts. Since last year we have been working on the My Skills, Teamwork and My World Challenge badges. We have learnt so much and had so much fun! We have had a variety of experiences from inventing a machine, making seed bombs, building structures, making some yummy food and learning about safety in the home and outside and money and saving.

The Beavers colony participated in many activities in line with the following Activity Badges:

- International Badge
- Builder Badge
- Safety Badge
- Cook Badge
- Book Reader Badge
- Experiment Badge
- Creative Badge
- Healthy and Fitness Badge
- Money Skills Badge

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We visited the local Fire Station when completing our Safety Badge. We talked about Palestine and reflected on the situation this spurred the group to collect £1163.75 in donations for Gaza for Islamic Relief!

During the autumn, the Muslim Scouts Forum held its Olympics in Sheffield, during which the Beavers competed against other groups across the country. Our group of Beavers had a wonderful experience, and we brought home gold and bronze medals as a result.

Some Beavers also attended the Winter Space Camp which was a fantastic experience! They made their beds, washed their dishes land earnt about constellations!! It was cold but we had so much fun building a fire, singing songs around the campfire and having roasted marshmallows and smores!

It is important that parents take advantage of these opportunities. The Beavers can witness their connection to a large community of Scouts.

We took a break for Ramadan, but the Beavers were still working on earning their Skills Challenge Badges. We also participated in the successful Iftar under the Stars event.

As a part of our award system, we have been recognizing good behaviour and encouraging beavers to do better. The 'Beaver of the Week' award has been working well as it is a good way to recognize good behaviour. Nibbles, our Beavers' mascot, is awarded to the Beaver who has really demonstrated the promise. The Beaver records the fun they have had that week and reports back to our group.

We also encourage Beavers to always be in their full uniform, and we do this by awarding points to each lodge whose Beaver does this. Our uniform gives everyone at Beavers a sense of belonging. Wearing a uniform is comfortable and practical. It means no one feels uncomfortable or left out, and it helps everyone feel part of the group. Please ensure your child is in uniform.

For the children to get the most out of the session, please ensure that they attend regularly, and for sessions they miss, it would be good to make up the requirements for badges at home. For those who miss sessions, they also miss out on completing badge requirements and so do not receive certain badges.

As we do have an extensive waiting list, if your child misses more than 3 sessions a term (without a valid reason) they will have to give up their space to someone who really wants to attend!

Often parents do not realize the amount of work leaders do on their own time and do not get paid for it. We take time away from our families and ourselves to do this for our young people. We would be grateful if parents could also offer their experiences and skills to support our programme – make be you are a cook or a nurse, we welcome parents to get in touch to organise their talents and skills and to share them with the beavers. Please have a word with our leaders to see how you could help us!

I would like to thank all parents for your continued commitment and support of Beavers. I hope your child is enjoying being part of the Beaver Colony.
